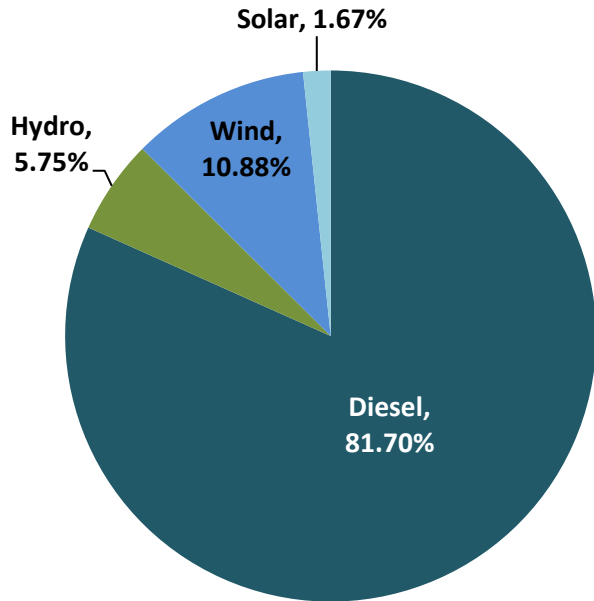


**Electricity sources**



The graph on the left shows the different types of energy sources used to produce electricity in Vanuatu in September 2016. The main energy source was diesel combustion which contributed 81.70% of the total electricity produced. 10.88% of electricity was generated from the Wind mills at Devil's point while hydro in Santo and solar generated 5.75% and 1.67% respectively.

**Electricity generation by area**

The top part of the following table shows the total energy produced from all available energy sources and the total quantity of diesel used to generate electricity in each concession area in September 2016. The bottom part of the table reveals how energy was generated in each concession area and the respective proportion of each energy sources.

**Fuel and electricity price index evolution**

This table links the monthly change of fuel price index, liters of fuel used, total power produced and the electricity price index in Vanuatu. Both indexes for fuel cost and electricity price started with 100pt base in January 2016.
