


VANUATU MONTHLY ENERGY MARKET SNAPSHOT IN MAY 2017



Electricity sources

The graph on the left shows the different types of energy sources used to produce electricity in Vanuatu in May of 2017. The main energy source was diesel combustion which contributed 81.1% of the total electricity produced. 11% of electricity was generated from the hydro in Santo whilst the wind mills at Devil's point and solar contributed 5.8% and 2.1% respectively.

Electricity generation by area

The top part of the following table shows the total energy production from all available energy sources and the total quantity of diesel used to generate electricity in each concession area in May 2017. The bottom part of the table reveals the contributing energy source generated in each concession area and their respective proportion.

Fuel and electricity price index evolution

This table links the monthly change of fuel price index, liters of fuel used, total power produced and the electricity price index in Vanuatu. Both indexes for fuel cost and electricity price started with 100pt base in January 2016.

This data does not include electricity productions outside of a concession agreement or MOU.
